

The conversation led the members to exchange their stories on how they chose to go to St Margaret's Secondary instead of other schools.

While sipping tea, we hummed along the various hymns from St Margaret's school days. It seems that those hymns had never changed throughout the years. Couldn't imagine our ages spanned across 40s to 80s!

It was a memorable afternoon with so much sharing and laughter. It was indeed a great opportunity to meet up during these challenging times for a blessed time of fellowship and to reminisce the good old days. We could not wait to organise another visit.
