SMPS PRIZE GIVING DAY

At St. Margaret's Primary School's Prize Giving Day, held at the School Hall on 14 November, Principal Ms Pang Wee Mian talked about 'cultivating the spirit of thankfulness'. She had shared with us that during the year, Primary 6 pupils were asked to reflect over the years they had been with St. Margaret's and write to their teachers their reasons for being thankful.

This was a wonderful reminder to the young girls. In today's world of busy-ness, we often forget to be thankful for the love, care and concern we receive from those who love us and care for our well-being.

Ms Pang also reminded us to always thank God for St. Margaret's noble and rich heritage and for His love and faithfulness over the years. St. Margaret's will always be our pride and joy.

We are also to be thankful for those who came before us, who have laboured, and for the benefits from which we have reaped. Ms Janet Lim and Mrs Mary Cassim were specially mentioned. Ms Janet Lim, in her book 'Sold for Silver', wrote about how she was sold to a rich towkay as a *mui tsai* and was rescued and boarded at CEZMS. In CEZMS, she received an education which prepared her to be trained as a nurse. Janet Lim eventually became the Matron of St. Andrew's Mission Hospital. As she felt that she had been so blessed, she wanted to be a blessing to others and the proceeds from her book were largely given to help needy children.

Mrs Mary Cassim was Principal of SMPS for 21 years. Her pupils fondly remembered her to be a gentle, kind and understanding person. They have learnt much from her.

Ms Pang also thanked all her staff and school partners for their love and support for the School.

Guest of Honour Ms Sum Chee Wah gave an inspiring speech, sharing her belief on what is important in life. She told the audience that her years in St. Margaret's had shaped her to be the person she is today. She experienced care and support. She recalled her young days in St. Margaret's and her appointment as one of the three teacher-helpers when Ms A K Lim was her teacher. This has led her to decide on a career in teaching. Starting as a Biology and Chemistry teacher, at age 33, she was appointed the principal of a secondary school, then the youngest principal ever appointed in Singapore. She later served in the Ministry of Education in various portfolios. Ms Sum is currently Advisor to Preschool Education at the Early Childhood Development Agency as well as MOE.



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Ms Sum also shared 'some of the important things in life' – there is life outside the classroom, reach out to those in need, make time for others, be sensitive to the needs of others; and on the personal side – pay attention to your interest, understand your strengths and weaknesses, experience many things, deepen bonds with family and friends.

She concluded by saying that Charity, Patience, Devotion are qualities to guide us when we leave St. Margaret's.

Two Secondary 3 students, namely, Amanda Loh Ming Huei and Chloe Theresia Ng from SMSS came to job-shadowed me at my legal firm for 5 days from 1 to 5 December 2014. Although it was a short stint, the time they had spent with me was a full-packed one.

I took them to the various courts such as the Family Justice Courts, the State Courts and the High Court to observe the various cases being heard at these courts. They also sat in to observe my attendance with clients and the work that I did in the office. They also helped me to carry out some clerical work.

Before leaving my office after the stint, they shared their job-shadowing experience with me as follows:-

From Amanda Loh, she says:-

“ Being able to work with a lawyer is really fun and exciting. At first, I was expecting a strict and stern mentor, but actually she was very kind and cheerful. She patiently guided and taught us, and making work fun as well. Being able to work with a lawyer was an eye-opener for me. It was not as glamourous as I have thought it would be. In fact, it was a tough, strict and onerous job that requires a lot of patience, honesty and integrity. I was really intrigued on how the courts system works. Being able to go and see the three courts really excited me and I learnt a lot from the experience. Overall, this work attachment was meaningful and fun. It has further inspired me to become a lawyer.”



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And from Chloe Ng, she shares the following:-

“ Working with Ms Ho has been a really enriching experience. Throughout these 5 days, we followed Ms Ho to the Family Justice Courts, State Courts and High Court, and she explained the court procedures very patiently in each of the 3 courts in Singapore. We also learnt about handling several cases, namely, probate matters, sale and purchase of property, family matters, etc. I have truly enjoyed myself those 5 days as I get a first-hand experience on what being a lawyer is like. After this work experience, I am even more encouraged to be a lawyer to help people who need my help. I am extremely thankful for this experience to job-shadow in M/s Ho & Associates.”

The service, led by SMPS Chaplain, Revd Steven Seah, commenced with the singing of the School Hymn. The lyrics remind us of God's unfailing love and mercies on St. Margaret's and for us to be faithful to Him and 'To serve and love always'. Singing the School Hymn is truly uplifting!

The Scripture, read by SMPS Principal, Ms Pang Wee Mian, was taken from Deuteronomy 32:7 and 8:7.

"Remember the days of old; consider the generations long past. Ask your father and he will tell you, your elders, and they will explain to you. When the Most High gave the nations their inheritance, when he divided all mankind, He set up boundaries for the peoples according to the number of sons of Israel."

SMSS Chaplain, Revd Barry Leong, in his sermon, said that 'we are to remember' those 'before us' and what they had done for us. As is sung in our School Hymn, *"They reap not where they laboured, We reap what they have sown;....."*
