SMPS Concert Entitled 'Yesterday Once More'

St. Margaret's Primary School held a concert on 30 June 2018 in Kallang Theatre. Mrs Wong Hoe Eng, whose association with SMS goes a long way, graced the occasion. She was a student at SMS in the 1930's after which she served as a teacher till her retirement in 1980. She then served in the School Management Committee. In a video presentation of her, Mrs Wong reminisced about her memorable time with the school.

The theme of the concert was 'Yesterday Once More'. A grandmother was recounting to her granddaughter, Genevieve, her various experiences in her past which had helped shaped her character of resilience. She also shared about previous school concerts featuring extra-curricular activities which became the springboard for the concert items to be showcased in this year's concert.

The concert items elicited a sense of nostalgia among the more senior audience as songs of yesteryears rang through the concert hall, be it in the Primary 1's energetic and vibrant coordinated dance or the Primary 2's ethnic fusion drums. The school choir, with their angelic voices, gave their rendition of a potpourri of multi-lingual songs. In the song 'Little Red Dot', written with a local flavour both literally and figuratively, they sang about traditional foods such as ice-kachang, chilli crab, nasi ayam, appam, ham jin beng and sambal belachang. putu mayam and chicken rice.

Every item presented, be they the harmonica ensemble, the band's items or the graceful Chinese and International dances, indeed transported the audience to 'Yesterday Once More'.

When asked what he thought of the concert, Marcel Bek, whose sister performed in the choir expressed, "I like how the concert showcased the CCAs along with a skit to show us what went on in the school in the past and present. SMESA SPEAKER SERIES – “*Breakthrough*”

An ex-student, Ms Jenny Chiam, was invited to give a talk at the SMESA Speaker Series for the upper level students on Tuesday, 22 May 2018. In her topic, “*Breakthrough*”, she shared some of her life experiences of courage, flexibility and risk taking.

Jenny started with describing the challenges she faced when climbing Mount Kilimanjaro, the highest mountain in Africa. Despite facing many obstacles such as altitude sickness, she completed the climb within 7 days. Prior to the expedition, Jenny was involved in rigorous swim training for a full year.

She then spoke about her stint as a volunteer Zookeeper at age 16. Although she had no experience, Jenny landed the job and got a chance to work with many different animals. As she was also fascinated in genetics, this exposure gave her the opportunity to learn and do research at the Singapore Zoological Gardens.

Jenny next revealed that she was inspired by her Grandfather, to whom she looks up to as a role model and a risk taker. Although her family were mainly in the medical field, it was he, who advised her to take up 'Finance' as he felt that it was another avenue where she could help other people.

Jenny wrapped up by reflecting on her days at St. Margaret's Secondary School where she was the Swimming Captain, a Girl Guide and a Prefect. All these experiences helped prepare her to 'Be a Leader' 'Be Prepared' & 'Be Kind' as a person.
