PERI-Upgrading at SMPS

(Support Our PUP)



The Ministry of Education (MOE) has been upgrading primary school infrastructure to support holistic education and the use of engaging teaching methods.. As such, facilities like Subject Based Banding Rooms, Learning Support Rooms, Indoor Sports Hall (ISH), Dance Studio will be provided in PERI Upgraded schools.

SMPS will be undergoing PERI Upgrading in 2020. It is also timely for SMPS to upgrade her infrastructure as the school was last upgraded almost 20 years ago in 1999 under PRIME (Programme for Improving Existing Schools). SMPS will need to raise \$\$1.26million but the figure is expected to rise to include some non-standard items to support teaching and learning.

"Support Our PUP" (<u>PERI Upgrading Project</u>) is the tag line coined by the fundraising committee. The school will embark on various fundraising activities to raise funds for this project the next two years.

To kick-start the fundraising, SMPS held its mini-Funfair on 6 July 2019, helmed mainly by the staff and students and strongly supported by SMC, SMESA and PTA (Parent-Teacher Association). The fund raised, which surpassed the school's target by 25%, was an encouraging start.

To facilitate the extensive two years' upgrading which involves demolition and rebuilding, the school will be moving to a temporary site at 2 Mattar Road (previously Macpherson Primary School) on 18 November 2019.

We would like to thank the many hearts and hands that come together to raise funds and contribute towards providing a better and more conducive learning environment for our girls. We look forward to your support and would like to appeal to you to donate* generously to the building fund to "Support Our PUP". Your donation will go a long way to benefit future generations of SMPS students.
