SMESA Speaker Series - Mrs Chua-Lim Yen Ching

What is my Internal GPS? - 18 October 2011

Success is not about results, power or wealth; success is who you are as a person

The second speaker in the Series, Mrs Chua Yen Ching, is Principal of Northlight School at Dunman Road, whose mission is to be “a choice school of youth prepared for life and living”. SMESA is proud to introduce an alumna of both St. Margaret’s Primary School and St. Margaret’s Secondary School to the girls with an inspiring talk about acquiring a fulfilling life through self-awareness.

As an introduction, Mrs Chua recounted her father’s firm belief in the importance of a good character. “If you receive a C for your subjects, I will teach you; if you receive a C for your character, I will whack you”. Naturally, he sent his daughter to St Margaret’s, where good values are taught. At Hwa Chong Junior College, she performed well for the “A” Level Examination to gain admission to Faculty of Medicine but chose instead to pursue a degree in Science in preparation for a teaching career, that eventually saw her starting out as a teacher at Dunman Secondary School. Over the years, she was appointed Head of Department (Science) at Dunman; Vice-Principal of Tanjong Katong Girls’ School; Principal of Zhonghua Secondary School; Principal of Shuqun Secondary School, and Deputy Director of Curriculum Planning at Ministry of Education.

In 2006, Mrs Chua-Lim Yen Ling was picked, for her zeal in helping students who have difficulties coping with their studies, to head Northlight School where the curriculum is designed to help students who repeatedly failed the Primary School Leaving Examinations, with an emphasis on character development.

An engaging speaker who “toyed with props” such as colorful strings and a flexible frame to demonstrate her points, she regaled the audience with humorous anecdotes of her school, and showed video clips of two pupils who managed to overcome their learning problems, Mrs Chua certainly made our girls (and SMESA members too!) listen with rapt attention.

The talk was peppered with Mrs Chua’s wonderful sense of humor; to impress the four essentials of a wholesome life on the girls’ memory, she proudly declared that “success to significance”, “mission-oriented”, “sound character” and “striking a balance” translated into the acronym “S.M.S.S.”, to the delight of the audience who instantly recognized the association to their school. That she is an experienced educator who understands the teenage psyche cannot be denied when she chose to play a video clip on the visit by a well-known footballer to Northlight School. The sight of Luis Nani of Manchester United immediately sent our girls sighing and screaming!

To conclude the session, Mrs Chua dramatically held up a square frame to her face with this piece of advice to the audience: ***“In encountering a problem difficult to resolve, reframe the problem”***, and hey presto, the square frame turned into a round frame in the blink of an eye!

For everyone present in the school hall, this was definitely a talk one was glad not to have missed...

SMSEA Job Shadowing 2011

In collaboration with SMSS in its Career Guidance Programme, our members, **Sara Liew** (from **Central Chambers Law Corporation**) and **Pixie Ho** (from **Ho & Associates**) each took in 2 students to be attached to their law practices for Job-Shadowing stints in November 2011.

The students gained invaluable experiences in their job-shadowing stints and have written the following articles to share their experiences:-

From Natalie Low Jia Wen (Sec 3E -2011):-

"When I first heard of this work attachment, I was very excited at the idea of job-shadowing a lawyer and observe her working at such close proximity.

Having been attached to Ms Ho, I felt that I have learnt more than I expected. After the work attachment, I feel more knowledgeable about the law world in Singapore. Ms Ho had very kindly set her work aside to bring us to the different courts in Singapore – the High Court, Family and Juvenile Court and the Subordinate Courts. I felt so privileged to be able to go to such places. We were also able to sit in and listen to many different cases, and to watch how the whole proceedings took place.

I felt very happy when I was able to help Ms Ho in mundane chores like photocopying documents and simple administrative duties, as I felt it was the least that I could do to help her. I also learnt more from the cases that she handles, making the Courts rounds and observing the happenings around me.

This work attachment was very satisfying. I have learnt a lot from the experience. It really opens up my eyes to everything around me. I would recommend that if you ever have this opportunity for such an experience, take it and enjoy it as you'll start to see many things differently and feeling more educated and more observant about things around you".

And from Tiffany Ong (Sec 3E - 2011):-

"This job shadowing experience has brought me many new memories, useful lessons and allowed me to be able to explore new things. I would describe this experience as a memorable and thrilling one. Through this experience, I have learnt a lot from Ms Ho in terms of the law aspect as well as good moral values.

There were also some light moments when Ms Ho told us jokes and stories about some cases, which were very hilarious. Furthermore, the best part of this work attachment was having the chance to visit the various courts. I loved going to the courts because it was a whole new exposure to me. I feel that this experience is very valuable though the duration was a little too short.

This opportunity is very hard to come by. Not only did I get to learn from a REAL lawyer but also get to visit REAL courts in Singapore. I feel that through this learning experience, it has widened my horizon and also increased my level of interest in this occupation. In addition, the experience has made me more confident and convinced of what I want to be when I grow up. My current ambition is to become a psychologist or a lawyer. or maybe both! But I feel that being a lawyer would be more interesting as you will be in contact with different people with different backgrounds, races and problems".
