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PRESIDENT WRITES...

SHARING A BURGER

The title and the following story were from the daily devotional, *Our Daily Bread*.

The story told of a woman who had the opportunity to visit the child she sponsored under an international compassionate programme. When there, she decided to take the child, who was living in 'abject poverty' for some food. The boy ordered a hamburger and the sponsor a salad. The food was brought to the table. It was a meal he had probably never witnessed in his life. He looked at his huge hamburger and then at the sponsor's small salad. The he took his knife, cut the burger into half and gave half to the sponsor. He rubbed his tummy and asked 'Hungry?'



This child who had virtually nothing in his entire life was willing to share half of his burger with someone he thought might need more. This hungry little boy's act truly tugged at your heartstrings!

Strangely, or perhaps not quite so, this story came to me whilst I was walking through the new Heritage Gallery at its recent opening at SMSS on 10 February. The tugging of the heartstrings on our founder, Mrs Maria Dyer that afternoon when she saw the poor young girls being sold on the streets as she landed in Singapore, must have been so great that she decided to stay on to help these girls. The care and love she had for the girls must have been as compelling as those felt by the little boy for his sponsor whom he thought was hungry like him and therefore the salad she had was not sufficient to assuage her hunger. His little act also shows the big thankful heart he has.

What a privilege all St Margaret's girls have, being a part of this noble heritage – that our School was founded on love and compassion. The leaders of our Schools through the years have lived out this heritage. At the opening of the Heritage Gallery, Boarder Elizabeth Ezekiel from class of 1958 shared with TODAY how Principal Norah Inge took her into the School after her father died and her mother was not in a position to take care of her. When she completed her secondary school, she thanked Ms Inge for giving her a roof over her head and an education. Ms Inge's words to her were 'Pass it on'.

Our Schools continue to help the girls to cultivate a thankful heart and to be compassionate and caring, upholding the School's motto *Charity, Patience, Devotion*. There are people in need everywhere, every day. Some are perhaps just around the corner in need of food or a kind word. Let us be a blessing to them.
